

Introduction define the word "self-control" with your students. What does it mean to have self-control? Review what the three colors of a stop light represent: Red = Stop Yellow = Caution Green = Go

Energize your classroom with Red Light, Green Light, a fun movement game using a traffic light widget to cue hopping, stepping, and stopping for K-8 students.

When prompted to reflect on a learning target or readiness for a task, students place the color on their desk that describes their comfort level or readiness (red: stuck or not ready; yellow: need support ...)

Simply set the desired amount of time and watch as the timer lights up green before switching to red when the time runs out. The possibilities of this fun and visual educational tool are endless.

Green signals "go to the bathroom," red means "no interruptions during direct instruction," and yellow indicates "only urgent interruptions." Position it strategically: Place the light where all ...
