

Things you need to know about crossing the Allenby Bridge as a tourist between Palestine and Jordan. Costs, transportation, and what it is like.

Named after a British military commander, General Edmund Allenby, the bridge operates under a complex system involving Jordanian, Israeli, and Palestinian authorities.
