

If you describe someone as passive, you mean that they do not take action but instead let things happen to them.

We make the passive by putting the verb "to be" into whatever tense we need and then adding the past participle. For regular verbs, we make the past participle by adding "ed" to the infinitive.

BPON, EPON, GEPON, and GPON have the same basic wavelength plan and use the 1490 nanometer (nm) wavelength for downstream traffic and 1310 nm wavelength for upstream traffic. 1550 nm is reserved for optional overlay services, typically RF (analog) video.

The total available bandwidth on a PON is divided between all users that are connected to that PON, i.e. each user is allocated a portion of the total available bandwidth by traffic manager.
