

What is the spacing between holes in a cable tray

Check Regulations: Consult the National Electrical Code (NEC) or your local regulations regarding cable tray fill ratios (usually max 50%) and support spacing (typically every 1.5m to 2m).

Spacing Standards: Electrical (power) and instrumentation (signal/control) cable trays should maintain a minimum vertical and horizontal distance. Industry standards often recommend at least 300mm (12 ...

Support spacing: NEC 392.18 requires cable trays to be supported at intervals consistent with the manufacturer's installation instructions, but not more than the maximum span listed for the ...

According to NEC Article 392.10 (B) (1) (c), the maximum allowable rung spacing for cable trays supporting these sizes of single conductor cables is 9 inches (229 mm).

The exception is that 9 inches is the maximum allowable rung spacing for a ladder cable tray supporting any 1/0 through 4/0 single conductor cables [See Section 392.10 (B) (1) (a)].
